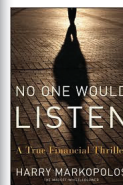
## SPEAKERS

### RABBI STEPHEN FUCHS



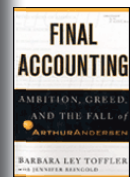
**Rabbi Stephen Fuchs** was ordained in 1974 and has been Senior Rabbi of Congregation Beth Israel since 1997. He has written and lectured extensively on subjects pertaining to Jewish life and ethics. He has served as an adjunct faculty member at Hartford Seminary and Saint Joseph College and is a member of the National Commission on Social Action of Reform Judaism. In the Spring of 2004, Rabbi Fuchs received the first annual Judaic Heritage award from the Charter Oak Cultural Center. In October 2006 he was awarded the "Legion of Honor" award by the Chapel of Four Chaplains. This is a national non-profit organization which gives this prestigious honor to those who exhibit outstanding volunteer service to one's community without regard for faith or race.

### HARRY MARKOPOLOS



**Harry Markopolos** is the author of *No One Would Listen: A True Financial Thriller* where he discusses how he and his team cracked the Madoff Ponzi scheme. He was an equity derivatives portfolio manager at Rampart Investment Management Company, Inc. in Boston. In 2002, he was promoted to Chief Investment Officer but he decided to leave the industry in 2004 to pursue fraud investigations fulltime against Fortune 500 companies in the financial services and health care industries. He brings fraud cases to the US Department of Justice and the Internal Revenue Service under existing whistleblower bounty programs. The Madoff investigation was his first fraud case, which he started in early 2000. He's been hooked ever since.

### BARBARA LEY TOFFLER



**Barbara Ley Toffler, Ph.D.**, is the author of *Final Accounting: Ambition, Greed, and the Fall of Arthur Andersen*, described as "a fascinating insider exposé." Dr. Toffler, a former Harvard Business School professor with a Ph.D. from Yale, was brought in to Arthur Andersen as a partner to develop consulting services in Ethics and Responsible Business Practices. She left Andersen four years later, because of many of the concerns that are now common knowledge. Dr. Toffler has been prominent in the field of business ethics since the early 80's. She currently serves as Town Councilwoman of Teaneck, NJ, and provides expert testimony on management ethics to several law firms throughout the country.
